THE PRESENCE OF DARKNESS THREATENS I. **OUR HOPE**

- A. Brokenness and darkness surrounded Israel due to sin & corruption. (Isa. 9:2–7)
- B. Jesus is the **<u>fulfillment</u>** of prophecy-one born as a light in the darkness and a hope for all people. (Matt. 1:22–23)

II. GOD'S PRESENCE HAS COME TO GIVE US HOPE

- A. Hope is not the absence of conflict, difficulty, struggle, or trial-it is the presence of God.
- B. Seeing God's faithfulness in the past gives us hope in the present and trust for the future. (Rom. 15:4)
